## Rebuilding

At this time of the year, we are thinking about new life, specifically because Jesus has risen from the dead, promising us life in his kingdom, both in the present and after we die. This new life is given to us and makes us feel refreshed, rebuilt into the people that we hoped we might be, living in the knowledge of God's love and his purposes for us.

As we think of being rebuilt into new people, our thoughts probably turn to what is happening in Ukraine at the time of writing this. Some cities, towns and villages have been so badly damaged that it will take many years to rebuild them. Hopefully the people of Ukraine can be free to rebuild not only their towns, but their lives too.

But the message of Jesus' resurrection is that whatever pain people have gone through, their lives can be rebuilt. Of course, pain and the trauma of war makes this an extremely difficult task, rebuilding lives after this will not be easy. But perhaps we know from our own limited experience that God can transform us, restore our lives, rebuild our present and future and that darkness never has the last word. Rather the light and peace of the resurrection floods into our lives whatever we have been through. Hopefully we can continue to pray for the people of Ukraine as they go through the process of rebuilding their lives and their cities.
