Contentedness

“I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do all this through him who gives me strength.”
Philippians 4:12-13

Paul gives us a challenge in these verses from Philippians. It's about contentment and how we might find it. Often, we think it's all about having the right things, or being secure, having money, being well fed. But Paul says it's actually not that. Contentedness can happen whether he was poor or rich, whether he was well fed or hungry. Being content comes about through strength given by God.

So why is this a challenge? Perhaps because we want to control everything, we don't really want God to be in charge, we want to believe that every decision is up to us and that we are completely responsible for everything. One catchphrase that perhaps sums this up is “Let go and let God.” But ultimately it is the letting go that we find difficult, instead we cling to our ability to sort things out and forget about God's role in our lives.

Perhaps this is what makes St Paul so inspiring, because he had a deeper understanding both of human nature and of God's role in making us content if we live in his strength. So perhaps we might be inspired by St Paul to take the strength of God more seriously in bringing contentment to our lives.

Welbury Churchyard Information File & Church Information File

St Leonard's Church often has visitors looking for members of their family tree, none more memorable than the time a headstone was discovered during the annual churchyard tidying day only to be the headstone visitors were looking for that arrived very soon after it was uncovered! The headstone was Ann Mawer from 1746! Full details of the find are in the church information file.



The churchyard information file contains a list of monumental inscriptions (many of which are no longer decipherable), an index of surnames and a plan of the churchyard showing where the headstone with that particular surname is located. It also contains the burial records from 1698 to the present day. Some graves are unmarked and, for those that are known, another plan and list showing these is also included

Both files can be found in a clear plastic box with a black lid in the church porch. Please replace the lid securely after use.
