


Family Service – at St Leonard’s Welbury

Sunday 10th July, 11am Sea Sunday will be an outdoor service, weather permitting. Please bring a towel as water will be involved!



Feast of St Ignatius of Loyola – July 31st

St Ignatius of Loyola was a soldier who was injured in battle and whilst recovering from a badly wounded leg had a number of close experiences of God. He later founded the Jesuits and wrote a classic book of spirituality called “The Spiritual Exercises.” One of these exercises is particularly helpful in challenging us in our attitude to following Jesus.

Ignatius uses a military image, that of the standard and says that there are two standards, that of the devil and that of Jesus, we have to decide on which side, under which standard we are going to live and die. To help us to recognise the two armies, he asks us to imagine two plains on which they are based and describes their character.

The devil’s standard draws people who are seeking worldly honours. They want to be praised and told that they are successful because they are special people and it’s all their own doing. Ignatius says *“The first step, then, will be riches, the second honour, and the third pride. From these three steps the evil one leads to all other vices.”*

However, under Christ’s standard people are drawn who are content to suffer insults and hardships. Again, Ignatius says of this standard “Hence, there will be three steps: the first, poverty as opposed to riches; the second, insults or contempt as opposed to the honour of this world; the third, humility as opposed to pride. From these three steps, let them lead people to all other virtues.”

One compels, the other gently draws us to follow him. We are all of us challenged to see whose standard we choose and whether we need to do more to follow Jesus’ call.


