

## “On Eagles’ Wings”

Birds are often used as symbols in the Bible – sometimes of freedom (e.g., Psalm 127:4 We have escaped like a bird from the snare of the fowler) - or of compassion (e.g., Luke 13:34 How often I wanted to gather your children together, just as a hen gathers her brood under her wings.) Some of the most striking images are of Eagles. If we have been fortunate enough to see eagles flying high in the skies of Scotland or elsewhere, then we can relate to the idea of Isaiah 40:31 “those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not be faint.” There is something about relying on God’s strength that we can be reminded of – rather than being earthbound and dejected our souls can soar away when God comes close to us.

Another famous image of eagles is of God helping the people of Israel escape from the Egyptians, “You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles’ wings and brought you to myself.” (Exodus 19:4.) There is something magnificent about birds, their freedom, their apparent ability to defy gravity and inhabit the skies with grace and ease. It’s these factors that make the authors of several books in the Bible use birds as symbols for freedom, of power, strength and compassion. Perhaps no bird is mightier than the eagle and none has inspired so many authors, with an image that equates God’s love with the power to soar away and be borne to freedom.


## **WAGs (Welbury Aged Gentlemen – not necessarily from Welbury!)**
